- Currently in the U.S., there are approximately 8 networked devices per person, a number expected to climb to 13.6 per person by 2022 according to the <u>Cisco Visual Networking</u> <u>Index 2018</u>.
- The average fiber-connected household generated 86 Gigabytes of data per month in 2017 and will generate 264 Gigabytes per month by 2022, according to the <u>Cisco VNI</u>.
- Data also shows home values may increase when connected to a fiber internet service.
